About the Position

Essential Functions of Role

The Director of Education is a forward-facing role whose primary function is to drive and foster a culture of care for people with Parkinson's and their care partners. This role is accountable for creating the overall education strategy for the Foundation and for developing and delivering content and education to people with Parkinson's, care partners, and Parkinson's health care providers. They work directly with the Marketing, Development, and Community Engagement teams to ensure the right content and education is delivered to the right people in the right way. Additionally, the Director of Education works very closely with all of those in the Parkinson's community, including people with Parkinson's, care partners, allied health professionals, and physicians.

- Establishes and maintains relationships with Parkinson's experts to provide expertise, content, and advice regarding patient education
- Responds to queries and communicates daily with all stakeholders in the Parkinson's community to increase knowledge, track trends, and identify future areas for educational development
- Ensures constant diversity of voices and perspectives when creating content, telling stories, and delivering education
- Checks content for legal, ethical, and accuracy concerns
- Creates and owns education department budget
- Consults Community Engagement, Development, and Marketing teams on curriculum for trainings and workshops and content
- Works with the Director of Marketing to optimize content for performance on various channels and to different audiences
- Identifies areas of opportunity and continues to refine content strategy to grow our authority and reach new people affected by Parkinson's
- Leads initiatives to survey constituents about Foundation resources, specific programs, and all content

- Ability to travel occasionally and work evenings and weekends if necessary
- Support and build the Foundation's reputation as a leading resource for living well tools
- Communicate the importance and usability of the Foundation's programs
- Assist in other activities on the behalf of the Foundation

Qualifications

- Bachelor's degree (Master's degree in adult education, teaching, curriculum and instruction, educational leadership, or related preferred).
- Minimum of 5-8 years' experience working in multimedia content production
- Minimum of 5-8 years' experience in designing curriculum for on- and offline course materials and delivering educational programs
- Experience with community health, healthcare organizations, and knowledge of Parkinson's highly desired
- Exceptional verbal and written communication

- Experience building trust and rapport with stakeholders including board of directors, peers, direct reports, donors, volunteers, colleague organizations, and others - effectively inspiring and supporting new levels of engagement activities with the Foundation
- A positive and authentic approach to relationship-building that is motivated by the Foundation's mission and a genuine investment in improving the lives of individuals affected by Parkinson's
- Bilingual proficiency (Spanish and English) is a plus
- Proficiency in MS Office 365 applications
- Experience with WordPress preferred
