




Relationship Changes




Signs of Caregiver Stress

- Depression
- Anxiety
- Irritability / over-reacting
- Feeling resentful
- Feeling rundown / exhausted
- Difficulty sleeping
- New or worsening health issues
- Trouble concentrating
- Addictions:
 - Smoking
 - Drinking
 - Eating more

Signs of Caregiver Burnout

Persistent symptoms of caregiver stress PLUS:

- Neglect of your own health and needs
- Feeling helpless and/or hopeless
- Isolation – feeling that life revolves around your caregiving
- Lack of enjoyment and satisfaction with things you once enjoyed
